

City Council to Hold Mass and Cass Emergency Declaration Hearing Tonight

The Boston City Council will hold a public hearing tonight at 6 p.m. regarding a proposed emergency declaration for the Mass and Cass area. The hearing takes place at Hampton Inn and Suites on Massachusetts Avenue.

Councilor Ed Flynn has proposed declaring a public health and safety emergency at the intersection of Massachusetts Avenue and Melnea Cass Boulevard and surrounding neighborhoods. The resolution addresses ongoing issues with open-

air drug markets, homelessness, and public safety concerns affecting nearby communities including the South End.

Councilor Sharon Durkan previously blocked an immediate vote

BACK TO SCHOOL

Know And Obey The School Bus Law

Massachusetts requires that vehicles stop for a busthat has flashing lights and an extended stop sign, when you are driving behind or toward the bus.

You may resume driving when

the lights top flashing or the sign folds back in.

These rules apply to pupil transport vehicles—like vans, station wagons, or family sedans, that have flashing red lights and "SCHOOL BUS" signs on top.

Failing to stop or illegally passing a stopped school bus with flashing lights can result in \$250 fine in Massachusetts, at minimum. A second offensebyafineofnotlessthan\$500.

The Mayor's Race Incumbent Mayor Michelle Wu faces three challengers in the September 9 preliminary election: retired police officer Robert Cappucci, community organizer Domingos DaRosa, and Josh Kraft, business and nonprofit executive.

South End City Council Races

At-Large Seats (4 available) All four incumbents are running for re-election: Council President Ruthzee Louijeune, Julia Mejia, Erin Murphy, and Henry Santana. They face several challengers including: Frank Baker, Yves Mary Jean, Marvin Mathelier, Rachel Nicole Miselman, Will Onuoha, and Alexandra Valdez. More than eight candidates qualified for the ballot, triggering a preliminary election where the top eight vote-getters will advance to the November general election.

District 7-The Race to Watch Eleven candidates are vying to replace Tania Fernandes Anderson, who resigned after pleading guilty to federal corruption charges: Said Abdikarim, Mavrick Afonso, Said Ahmed, Wawa Bell, Tchad Cort, Miniard Culpepper, Samuel Hurtado, Natalie Juba-Sutherland, Jerome King, Shawn Nelson, and Roy Owens.

District 2 - Incumbent Ed Flynn faces two challengers in the preliminary election: Charles Delaney and Brian Foley.

on Flynn's resolution, sending it to committee for further review. Durkan questioned whether an emergency declaration would provide additional resources to address the crisis.

The hearing is being conducted by Councilor John FitzGerald, who chairs the Public Health, Homelessness and Recovery Committee. FitzGerald initially faced pressure to delay the hearing until after the September 9 preliminary election, but resident advocacy led to tonight's scheduling.

Local residents, particularly from the South End, have expressed frustration with spillover effects from Mass and Cass, reporting safety concerns and quality of life issues in their neighborhoods.

Mayor Michelle Wu opposes the emergency declaration. Her administration maintains that the city is already utilizing available public health, safety, and works resources to address the situation and that an emergency declaration would not unlock additional authorities or funding.

The hearing represents ongoing debate about how Boston should address the complex issues of addiction, homelessness, and public safety at Mass and Cass.


