

### **Residents Mobilize Over Mass** and Cass Safety Concerns

South End residents are taking action as frustrations mount over public safety issues stemming from the Mass and Cass area, with new data showing a dramatic increase in arrests and community members organizing politically to address the

At a community meeting held last Thursday at Cathedral High School,

dozens of South End residents shared accounts of deteriorating conditions in their neighborhood, with some saying they're considering relocating as their only option to feel safe again, according to the Boston Herald. One father asked Boston Public Health Commissioner Bisola Ojikutu what mattered more: his children's right to grow up safely in

#### Candidates

#### South End City Council Races

At-Large Seats (4 available) Eight Candidates Advance to At-Large City Council Race

Boston voters will choose from eight candidates for four at-large City Council seats in the November 4 general election.

All four current at-large councilors secured spots on the ballot: Ruthzee Louijeune, Julia Mejia, Erin Murphy and Henry Santana as well as Frank Baker, Alexandra E. Valdez, Marvin Dee Mathelier and Will Onuoha.

The top four vote-getters in November will serve four-year terms representing the entire city on the Boston City Council.

District 7-Candidates Said Ahmed (often referred to as "Coach Ahmed" on the ballot) and Miniard Culpepper race to replace former councilor Tania Fernandes Anderson, who was recently sentenced to prison on federal corruption charges.

District 7 encompasses parts of Roxbury, Dorchester, the South End, and the Fenway across six wards.

District 2 - Incumbent Ed Flynn faces challenger Charles Delaney.

Roxbury pudding stone edifice (along with gray limestone) to a height of 120 feet a century and a half ago, were similar in several ways to those who currently attend the Cathedral.

Boston's South End was in a state of transition during the second part of the nineteenth century. The demographics were changing - what was originally a largely non-Catholic section of the city transitioned as an enclave with a substantial immigrant population many of whom were Irish. And today, the Cathedral continues to serve an immigrant population. Indeed, Masses are celebrated not only in English but in Spanish, Latin (Extraordinary Form) and Ge'ez Rite (Ethiopian.) Masses are also held on weekdays and of course on weekends. There is also a later Sunday early evening Mass in English at 5:30 pm. This Mass seems to be particularly popular with the area's younger adults.

Coincidentally the dynamic is comparable today - although not with the Irish but with many other ethnic groups, many of whom share Catholicism as their religious heritage and who have made the South End their home. Indeed, with the many new developments in the South End, the population has emerged as a location where not just the number of inhabitants are increasing but the expansion of new businesses as well. It would not be unreasonable to suggest that this significant section of Boston has become vibrant and exciting, reflective of the growth and progress of the City of Boston itself.

The Cathedral started construction in April of 1866, and consecrated as the Cathedral Church of the Metropolitan See of Boston nine years later on December 8, 1875 by Archbishop John J. Williams. This year is the Cathedral's sesquicentennial. The building was designed in the Gothic Revival style by prominent church architect Patrick C. Keely; although based out of New York Keely designed hundreds of church buildings throughout the East including many in the Boston area. Keely himself was an Irish immigrant having roots in County Tipperary.

The imposing structure can boast measurements of 364 feet in length and 90 feet in width and holding a capacity close to 2000 people. When one enters from the vestibule, the beauty, color and all around ambiance that continues to be so much a component of the historic cathedrals in the Old World can truly be appreciated here too. The Cathedral also has a smaller chapel on the side as well as a lower church where Masses are also celebrated.

Monsignor Kevin J. O'Leary has been the rector since 2008; and in that time two apparent changes have occurred; one is the renovation of the interior and the other an increase in attendance. Indeed, Msgr. O'Leary indicates at the conclusion of the weekend Masses how grateful and encouraged he is that "so many young people-and young families worshiphere. After all, young people are the future of the Church!"

This year of 2025 has been an exciting anniversary year at the Cathedral; its religious observances, concerts, programs and other events allows visitors to not only enjoy and appreciate what this church offers but also permits one totruly grasp what a treasure this Cathedral is and it exists right here in the city.

The Masses during the weekend are as follows: Saturday in English at 4:30 PM and Sundays in English at 8:00 AM; 11:30 AM (with choir); and 5:30 PM. Spanish at 9:30 AM; Extraordinary Form (Latin) at 10:00 AM; and in the Alexandrian Ge'ez Rite at 1:00 PM. their neighborhood or other people's right to buy and use drugs, the Herald reported.

A resident who lives near Boston Medical Center told officials he had been calling 911 almost daily until September, describing the hospital as effectively hosting a public drug market on its front lawn, according to the Herald's coverage

Community CompStat meeting.

In response to the ongoing crisis, residents have formed a new political advocacy group. The Mass and Cass Political Action Committee was established to educate voters about the positions held by elected officials and candidates regarding issues facing residents, businesses, and workers in the area, according to a statement provided to The Daily Free Press on October 16.

The committee, which says it's funded by grassroots donations, aims to track how city council members and candidates address crime and safety concerns at the intersection of Massachusetts Avenue and Melnea Cass Boulevard.

#### The concerns come as new police statistics painta stark picture of the neighborhood's challenges. Between May 1 and August 24, 2025, the South End saw 478 arrests-a 163% increase from the 182 arrests during the same period in 2024. Boston.com reported on October 22. citing data from a Boston Police Department


