Advice on Pets, Life, Love

Dear Dog Lady,

I recently adopted a puppy, Biscuit, from a local rescue organization. She is seven-months-old and sweet as can be. I have had no real issues with her, except for the jumping! She jumps on me when I come home from work and jumps on guests when they visit. I consulted a trainer who told me to ignore her when she jumps and praise her when she sits calmly. This pup may be young but she is already 65-pounds and I can't

quite ignore that—especially when she is jumping and knocking over my guests. I'm not sure what to do. How do I get her to stop jumping?

Dear Lauren,

You must literally stand up to her. Hold out your hand (not in a threatening way) and in a calm voice order her to "sit." If she doesn't know this command, gently press her butt to the floor, telling her to sit. When she does the right thing, give her a treat. Hold out your hand again, like a traffic cop at an intersection. Keep your hand extended as you walk backwards, telling her to "stay." When she stays, dole out another goody. Biscuit must be motivated by the desire to please you—as well as the taste of a treat.

Instead of yelling at her and creating chaos around guests, you can put her in another room and bring her out to greet company calmly on a leash. If she tries to make a jump for it, go into the "sit and stay" routine. Always keep treats in your bocket to

reward her during these puppy years for anything she does well. You want to constantly reinforce good behavior.

The best way for you to be around your jumping dog is thoughtful. Use every opportunity as a teachable moment. The calmer you are, the calmer she will be. People who yell at their dogs have crazy dogs for a good reason.

Dear Dog Lady,

I was disappointed you were not tougher with the woman who rescued the Jack Russell terrier and whose boyfriend objected to the dog. The boyfriend was a guest in the woman's home. If he doesn't like dog hair on his clothes, he should move out. No dog deserves to be locked in the bathroom as this guy does when the dog bothers him. If the woman doesn't get rid of this guy, he will one day treat her like he treats the dog. Shame on her and on you for not being firm with her.

Rushing swept from office

9th Suffolk District State Representative Byron Rushing, who has served at the State House since his election in 1982, was defeated Tuesday night in the Democratic primary by Dr. Jon Santiago.

Rushing was the fourth-highest ranking Democrat in the house. Santiago is a Boston Medical Center emergency room doctor.

In the three person race Santiago received 2,230 votes, Rushing 1,758, Suezanne P Bruce 653.

Santiago made income inequality, opioid addiction, managing growth while protecting affordable housing centerpiece to his campaign.

During Representative Byron Rushing's 35 years representing the district he was apioneer on LGBTQ rights, civil rights, marriage equality, social justice, healthcare equity.

Cue Althea Garrison

Persistent candidate may join City Council

Boston City Councillor Ayanna Pressley's win over Representative Michael Capuano may have given Althea Garrison another shot at elected office.

Pressley will likely leave her position on the City Council. Garrison took fifth place last year in the at-large race, not making the cut. But Boston's election rules mean that Garrison would be next in line for the empty council seat.


Garrison is the first transgender person elected to a state legislature in the United States—she served one term as a Massachusetts state representative in 1992.

She has run unsuccessfully for office at least 16 times, most recently as an independent in the special election last May to replace state Senator Linda Dorcena Forry.

Local Focus Windows

Since early August, the library's Tremont Street window has featured the history of the Union United Methodist Church, a beacon of spiritual and social activism in South End history, now celebrating the 200th anniversary of its congregation. It is where in 1950 the NAACP voted to pursue what became the landmark case of Brown v. Board of Educa-

tion; where in 1966 the legendary Duke Ellington performed with the Duke Ellington Sacred Jazz Orchestra; and where, after the assassination of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., the MLK Memorial Breakfast was organized, an event which to this day attracts leaders from the business, civic and educational community, state-wide, each year.

Local Focus Windows Coming Up Next

SEPTEMBER: The window will feature an installation about the Ayer Mansion on Commonwealth Avenue, the only surviving building designed by Louis Comfort Tiffany, yes, he of the spectacular stained-glass lamps and windows. Longtime South Endresident, community activist and former FOSEL board member, Jeanne Pelletier, Esq., has been the moving force behind its restoration.

OCTOBER: Odyssey Opera will have an exhibitin the library window about its 2018-19 season of five opera performances: This fall, two operas will honor the 200th anniversary of the birth of composer Charles Gounod (The Queen of Saba and The Doctor in Spite of Himself); in spring 2019, three operas will celebrate the life of Helen of Troy (Paris and Helen by Christoph Willibald Gluck; The Egyptian Helen by Richard Strauss; and The Beautiful Helene by Jacques Offenbach). Gil Rose, the Odyssey Opera musical director and conductor, will discuss the program at the library on October 9 at 6:30 PM.

NOVEMBER: On display will be a unique and fun installation by artist and Boston public-school Kindergarten teacher, Eric Grau. His Cats and Crystals show will open at the South End library on November 3. Grau is a resident artist at the Piano Factory.

Library Park Renovation

The long-awaited improvements in Library Park have finally happened, a small miracle after a decade's worth of setbacks due to a range of financial, political and bureaucratic complications. Mayor Marty Walsh, our at-large and district city councilors (especially Ed Flynn) and the Parks Department's commissioner pulled a rabbit out of the hat earlier this summer to add funds needed for construction to begin and, lo and behold, the heavy equipment arrived in late July. Library Park's main renovations were completed by mid-August. New park furniture, as outlined in the design above, is on back order, but seating from the previous park that was still in good condition has been re-installed and is already being happily used (see below). Tree pruning, landscaping and other matters will happen in the near future.

South End Library Renovation

The short-term renovation of the downstairs interior of the South End library will begin sometime in January but details are still in the planning stage. There will be a public meeting with the architects and BPL leadership about the plans at the library sometime in late September/early October . Information will be made available to you as soon as we have it. Specifics will be announced on our website and in the next South End library update. (A separate program study for a longterm, multi-million-dollar renovation of the entire library building will also get underway sometime this year or early 2019.)


