the athletic, lovable, big brother, his family's tender touchstone, and gorgeous guidestar. Throughout his life, Billy remained close and caring to both his extended beloved Farmer family of birth origin, and to the wide, vast beating heart circle of gay family he created in Provincetown and Boston.

Basically anywhere in the world Billy went, love followed.

"Love is in the air," Billy spontaneously sang his favorite 1970's dance tune walking his dog Brady around the sublime beauty of Hatches Harbor, "Everywhere I look around! Every sight and every sound!'

Billy followed the muse of rhythm, the beat, the tempos, the syncopation of musical sounds in the air to rummage the bins of "Streetlight Records" and "Vinyl-mania" where his mega-12-inch collection of vinyl recordings began. As Patti Labelle sang, Billy would resound and twirl, "Music is My Life."

In the magical time in the world before AIDS, there were nights of wild unheeded dancing under the starlight dome of NYC's "The Saint" ("Baby powder on the dance floor makes for great spinning," Billy said), and the extravagant flamboyant sunset light at the late afternoon tea dance where he went every Thursday for its "golden disco" revivals. He met France Jolie and Sylvester, and he spoke of the sultry smokey spiritual voice of his favorite Barry White, and exuberant joy of "Love Seems to Hang On" from Ashford and Simpson, or "Nick and Val," as Billy always called them.

His extensive discography history and knowledge of 70's/80's gay dance club and groundbreaking Motown music was a neverending catalog of sound-wave memories and instrumental facts. Each song had its own story. An indelible moment in time. Sometimes a heartbreak, sometimes a kiss, but always - "In the whisper of the trees, in the thunder of the

seas, Love is in the air," said Billy,

"The air of Provincetown is like no other place," Billy also said. A 25 year resident of Provincetown, he found a spiritual space, sacred spots, secrets to scatter here and there in the beech forests, pond trails and rocks at Long Point. The reverence of its sparkling waters (" The sea looks covered in crushed diamonds.") and the luminous light of the full moons on dune hills, and moors, and the light of friendship of the many people he came to know and hold deep in his heart circle.

I could ever have imagined," Billy said at the end to his partner Jack.

As the song he always sang "Hold on to My Love", we hold onto him always and forever.

And all the affection and caring of his siblings who came, and stayed, and never once left Billy's side too: Gale Testa, Mary Doyle, Anne Momot (deceased), Martha Farmer, Michael Farmer, Timothy Farmer, Kathryn Mannino, and Brian Farmer, and his 17 nieces and nephews who came and stayed with him. My family provided me with the quality of life, safety, love, support, and the best send-off sunset. You can even hear the ocean at Herring Cove from Annie's tree. The seaglass you left in the bark is still there.

hit films like "Flashdance" and "Dirty Dancing," the 2018 show lacks the inventiveness and memorable new music of stage editions of "The Full Monty" and "Kinky Boots."

The shortcomings here are all the more disheartening since director-choreographer Jerry Mitchell fired up "The Full Monty" with such lively moves as a basketball-inspired ensemble and "Kinky Boots" with winning work for Lola and her entourage. Unfortunately, talented leads, several strong voices, and an especially versatile supporting player cannot make the tour of "Pretty Woman the Musical" a magical diversion.

Like "Flashdance" and "Dirty Dancing," "Pretty Woman" is too faithful to its 1990 film origin-seeming to favor easy duplication over imaginative development and going as far as returning to familiar quips from the Julia Roberts and Richard Gere-starring hit. The fairy tale-like blossoming of Vivian with Prince Charming-like Edward Lewis is all here-as the Hollywood Boulevard call girl moves during one week from suggestive street clothes to Beverly Hills attire and evening gown for "La Traviata" at the San Francisco Opera as their romance takes flight.

Sadly the book by Gary Marshall & J.F. Lawton (the latter who wrote the movie screenplay) never makes much of Vivian and Edward's respective transformations-factors that would account for the understanding and love that grow between them.

At the same time, the Bryan Adams & Jim Vallance score suffers from numbers that need more vivid detail and personal connection where the two main characters are concerned. Edward's solo "Freedom" fails to express full feeling about escaping from rough business practices and an all-work mindset. Vivian's "This Is My Life" ought to have much more to say about her openness to self-realization. If anyone bursts forth in this musical it is Happy Man-who becomes the Regent Beverly Wiltshire's hotel manager Barnard Thompson and a kind of Everyman as well as several other characters.

At least "Don't Forget to Dance" gives Thompson-played with charm and panache by Kyle Taylor Parker - an opportunity to let himself go. In fact, Thompson's suggested sexual fluiditydancing with male hotel staff as well as taking a turn with Vivian - comes across as more honest than relatively subdued

moments of intimacy between Vivian and Edward

Those moments should escalate in intensity-particularly with performers as talented as Olivia Valli and Adam Pascal (the original Roger in "Rent"). For the record, Valli and Pascal sing robustly and do their very good best to bring some fire to the generally weak score.

What is worse, Lawton's tame book prevents appealing Valli from doing justice to Vivian's early unrestrained high spirits. Likewise, dashing Pascal is forced to insert some entrepreneurial toughness to an underwritten characterization of Edward. Fans of the film will be surprised that Vivian-not Edward. unlike in the film--hits self-absorbed and sexually harassing business associate Philip. Big-voiced Jessica Crouch has a few moments to shine as Vivian's street colleague Kit De Luca, and Amma Osei displays beautiful tone as Violetta in "La Traviata.'

As always, Vivian rescues Edward right back. By contrast, no such rescue saves an essentially soulless "Pretty Woman the Musical.
