HOMELESS SERVICES AND HOSPITAL CAPACITY

On April 2nd, Mayor Walsh announced that construction begins at the Boston Convention and Exhibition Center to add 500 beds for treating homeless adults who have tested positive for COVID-19 and need care, but do not require full hospitalization.

The City has released a Request for Proposals to secure a partner organization to operate the facility. If necessary, the Convention Center beds will be opened up for hospitals to use for sub-acute COVID patients in the general population.

These 500 beds will bring Boston's total number of new beds for homeless individuals to over 1,000. This includes Boston Medical Center's Newton Pavilion facility, which the City and State are working to re-purpose as a medical facility for homeless residents affected by the coronavirus.

SMALL BUSINESS SUPPORT

On April 2nd, Mayor Walsh announced two new resources that will help small businesses during the public health crisis.

The City of Boston has created a Small Business Relief Fund. Drawing on a combination of City, federal, and private industry contributions, it establishes \$2 million in grant funding—capable of providing a lifeline to hundreds of local businesses at risk of shutting down permanently due to the crisis. It will be administered as a streamlined version of the City's Small Business Financing program. Small businesses can begin applying on Monday, April 6.

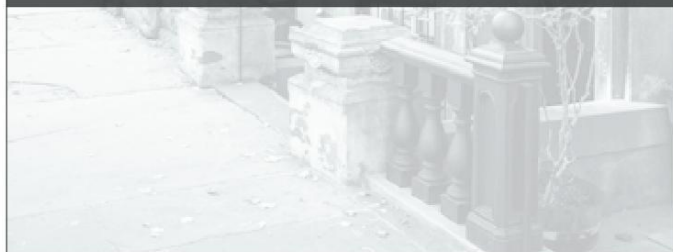

Suspect in Custody, Officers Recover Loaded Firearm

At about 3:50 AM on Saturday May 29, 2021, officers assigned to District D-4 (South End) made an onsite firearm arrest after responding to a call in the area of 725 Albany Street in Boston. On arrival, officers arrested Saquawana Anderson, 28, of Killeen, TX, after recovering a loaded 9mm Taurus handgun during an investigation inside the premises.

Police are looking for somebody who opened fire on Shawmut Avenue in the area of San Juan Street around 8:45 p.m. on Wednesday, May 26. One of the cars was occupied by somebody who may have been the intended target, but he was not injured.

Two Suspects in Custody , Officers Recover Loaded Firearm, Drugs, Cash

At about 8:45 AM on Wednesday May 19, 2021, officers assigned to the District C-6 (South Boston) and BPD Citywide Drug Control Units conducted an investigation which resulted in the arrests of two people from Swansee on firearm and drug related charges in the area of Massachusetts Avenue and Melnea Cass Boulevard in Boston. As a result, the officers were able to safely recover a loaded 9mm handgun, several loose rounds of ammunition, 25 grams of crack cocaine, 22

grams of fentanyl and an undisclosed amount of U.S. Currency.

Both suspects will appear in South Boston District Court on charges of Unlawful Possession of a Firearm, Unlawful Possession of Ammunition and Trafficking Class A and B Drugs.

66-Year-Old Arrested Following Non-Fatal Stabbing near the Southampton Street Shelter

At about 6:08 PM on Monday May 17, 2021, officers assigned to District C-6 (South Boston) and members of the Citywide Bicycle Unit responded to a call for a person stabbed in the area of 112 Southampton Street in Boston after an officer performing a paid detail at the shelter located an adult male victim on Atkinson Street. The victim was transported to a local area hospital for treatment of injuries which were considered to be non-life-threatening in nature. Although officers observed several people loitering about the area of the scene, they did not assist the officers with a description of the suspect or any account of what had just occurred. District detectives were eventually able to provide officers with a description of the suspect, a 66 year-old female, who was last seen operating a motorized scooter. Investigators later learned that the suspect had stabbed the victim before stealing an undisclosed amount of cash before fleeing the area.

At about 8:20 PM, C-6 officers who were committed to directed patrol around the shelter, observed the suspect as she returned to the area and were able to place her in custody without incident. The suspect will appear in Roxbury District Court on charges of Assault and Battery by Means of a Dangerous Weapon and Armed Robbery.
