## **Boston Community Pediatrics Doubles** In Size

Non-profit pediatric private practice unveils new space

#### SUBMITTED BY BCP

**Boston Community Pediatrics** (BCP), Boston's first and only nonprofit, pediatric private practice, is doubling its footprint with three new exam rooms, a care navigation suite, and expanded community space on an additional floor at their 527 Albany Street location.

The high demand for care rooted in equity has validated the concept founded by Dr. Robyn Riseberg in 2020. As the organization approaches its third anniversary, they have served more than 1300 patients, held a number of community events and partnered with critical partners to improve access to healthcare and other services to improve the social

determinants of health. A special event on October 12 will officially unveil the space.

"This new space will help deliver on our mission to increase access to high-quality health care for Boston's neediest families," said BCP Founder Robyn Riseberg. "In addition to seeing more patients, we'll be able to create better community connections and meet important needs such as navigating complex systems, housing issues and food insecurity which all ultimately affect a child's health and development."

BCP sees patients regardless of their insurance plan-and doesn't offer bifurcated levels of care based on the disparities of reimbursement by MassHealth and private insurance. Patients get what they need - and the philanthropic support for BCP fills the gap. A committed board has

#### Toddler found near Mass. and Cass

According to a Boston Police report, a 2-year-old toddler was found by an outreach worker near Southampton Street in the Mass. and Cass area on Friday. Police said the mother and child were in the area after her car was towed after being parked in the nearby McDonald's parking lot. She said she and her son spent Thursday night at Boston Medical Center. The child's mother and father were in the area, but the mother refused a ride home from the police, according to the police report.

The incident has raised concerns about the safety of children in the area known for drug use and violence. The Massachusetts Department of Children and Families is investigating, and city officials are considering measures to address the crisis in the neighborhood. Boston City Council President Ed Flynn wants the Boston Public Health Commission to conduct its own investigation into this incident, according to the Boston Herald.

"I think it's a troubling development," he told the Herald. "I want to first acknowledge the professionalism of our first responders, but having a child in the Mass. and Cass

#### Suspect Arrested Following A Stabbing Incident In Roxbury

At about 3:31 AM, on Tuesday, October 10, 2023, officers assigned to District C-6 (South Boston) arrested Uwadiae Ukponmwan, 30, of Boston, following a stabbing incident.

Officers were conducting a Code 19 (Walk and Talk) in the area of Southampton Street and Atkinson Street when they observed multiple people running from the area. Officers were advised that a person had been stabbed and were provided a description of the suspect.

Officers were quickly able to locate the suspect in front of Boston Fire Department Headquarters. The officers searched the suspect, and located a knife in the suspect's right shoe. The victim was transported to a local hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

Ukponmwan was placed under arrest and charged with: Assault and battery by means of a dangerous weapon. He is expected to be arraigned in Roxbury District Court.

## **BPL Announces 2023 Druker Award And Lecture**

David P. Manfredi, CEO & Founding Principal of Elkus Manfredi Architects

The Boston Public Library (BPL) announced that David P. Manfredi, CEO & Founding Principal of Elkus Manfredi Architects, is the 2023 recipient of the Druker Award Celebrating Design and Architecture. The Druker Award is presented annually to a leader who has made outstanding and important contributions to the world of design; each award recipient shares insights on the world of Architecture and Design at a corresponding lecture.

This year's event will take place on November 4, 2023, at 2:00 p.m. in Rabb Lecture Hallon the lower level of the Boylston Street Building. The talk is free and open to the public.

David Manfredi is known for his diverse portfolio of planning and design projects across the country and in the city of Boston, including Boston Landing (which features the New Balanceheadquarters, the TRACK at new balance, and the Bruins' Warrior Ice Arena, and the Celtics' Auerbach Center practice facilities), the Parcel 12 air-rights redevelopment (spanning the Mass Pike at the intersection of Newbury Street and Massachusetts Avenue), the Broad Institute in Kendall Square, and the research head quarters for Vertex Pharmaceu-

ticals. He has received recognition from multiplepreservation and design organizations for his leadership in renovating the South End's Cathedral of the Holy Cross and the Women's Clinic at St. Anthony Shrine.

"It is an honor to bestow the Druker Award upon David Manfredi, a visionary whose impact on the world of design has been nothing short of transformative," said BPL President David Leonard. "His passion for creating spaces that inspire, unite, and uplift has not

only transformed physical landscapes but also the way we experience and interact with our urban environments."

helped the non-profit raise more than \$8.5 million over the past 3 years to support the mission. This model has been hailed as replicable and could address these same challenges in other cities throughout the Commonwealth and beyond.

BCP Board Chair Lori Whelan noted, "In just three years, Dr. Riseberg's vision has transformed the healthcare experience for so many Boston families and we are committed to not only increasing Boston Community Pediatrics' reach, but sharing our successes and hope to inspire others to innovate in the same and similar ways."

In addition to well-visits, vaccinations and urgent care, BCP aims to address additional challenges that families face. At every visit, patients are given grocery bags and meals when available, a hygiene kit, diapers and wipes, menstrual products, and ageappropriate books in a dignified manner.

Throughout the year, the organization hosts events such as Thanksgiving Food Distribution, Holiday Shop and a Back-to-School Celebration where families can access needed items to make sure they can create a safe and happy home. Additionally, BCP is working with the practice-based care management (PBCM) program at MassHealth. Through BCP's success with this program, MassHealth has embarked upon a pilot with BCP to support some of their work with families who are homeless or housing insecure.

take on the Bard's great tragedy to vivid, often hilarious life in its area premiere at the Boston Center for the Arts' Calderwood Pavilion.

Ijames describes each of his play's characters as "kind of " their respective namesakes with good reason. While set in the backyard of a house which the playbill indicates could be in Virginia, Maryland or Tennessee , "Fat Ham" resembles Shakespeare's play without copying it. Gay protagonist luicy, "soft in body and temperament," has the demeanor of a thoughtful philosopher a la Hamlet himself. Some theatergoers may call to mind the Hebrew definition of Ham-warm, hot-as the title could be an allusion to his late Papi's restaurant.

As in Shakespeare's play, the uncle—here pig farmer and pit master Rev, a kind of Claudius, appears to be responsible for Papi's death (in prison, where he was imprisoned

for the killing of a man with very bad breath) yet marries his brother's wife Tedra—a kind of Gertrude. Innocent Tedra submits that "They did it (marrying the brother's widow) in the bible all the time.

Bible buffs may call to mind Tamar's marriage to Onan after the death of his brother Eir in Genesis. Also, Ijames refers to the biblical story of Jacob and Esau as rivals for Isaac's blessing in seeing Revas a "supplanter." Juicy's cousin and oldest friend Tio--a kind of Horatio-- advises about the depth of the cycles of violence-herevengefulviolence demanded by the ghost of Papi.

Will Juicy continue the cycles? Studying human resources digitally at the University of Phoenix, he does not come across as the tough heir the ghost of Papi demands. Instead, he soliloquizes a la Hamlet about the majesty of man and does test Rev's conscience a la Hamlet's strategy with the visiting players' staging-here with the solution of a charade that reads "The Preacher Killed the Cook."

At the same time, decorated Marine Larry-akind of Laertes but less confrontational than his Shakespearean counterpart—wants a 'softer' life and full connection with Juicy, whom, he admits, he would like to touch in more than a friendly way. Larry's spunky sister Opal-a kind of Ophelia-has same sex interests of her own-- interests that put her in conflict with their platitude-rich mother Rabby-a kind of Polonius. At one point, Tio coyly suggests that he is supposed to survive-as Horatio did in "Hamlet." Spoilers aside, expect closing surprises. With a combination of rich humor and sub-textual seriousness, playwright Ijames provides a denouement quite different from Shakespeare's but one that fully celebrates individual freedom-particularly for the younger characters.

Director Stevie Walker-Webb skillfully balances the play's singular humor and smartly understated seriousness with strong individual performances and sharp ensemble

moments. Marshall W. Mabry IV captures Juicy's inner strength and developing outer tenaciousness.

Ebony Marshall-Oliver has all of Tedra's maternal caring and snappy personal style as a newlywed. James T. Alfred proves equally convincing as the persistent ghost-who even emerges at the grill-and arrogant, self-serving Rev. Amar Atkins moves very convincingly from seeming stoicism to full emotional expression with Juicy. Lau'Rie Roach catches Tio's lively insights-notably in wonderfully amusing dialogue about gingerbread men. Victoria Omoregie finds Opal's sweetness and cockiness, and Thomika Marie Bridwell has Rabby's parental pushiness. High marks go to Luciana Stecconi's very welldetailed yard and back of house and Celeste Jennings' colorfully eclectic costumes.

Near the end of the play, Juicy observes that Larry looks like himself. Ultimately, the play's truthfulness about human connection makes "Fat Ham" a theatrical entrée to savor.
